Duwamish Valley Sea Level Rise (SLR) Adaptation Visioning

Help create a vision for addressing SLR flooding.

If you live or work in the Duwamish Valley, you know that the Duwamish Valley is often affected by flooding.



There are two kinds of flooding: coastal flooding and urban flooding.

Coastal flooding happens when the river rises and spills over its banks. This happened in December 2022. It is caused by high tide and storms, and made worse by sea level rise from climate change. The South Park neighborhood and industrial areas are mostly affected by coastal flooding from the Duwamish River going over its banks. It also affects some residents along the shore in South Park.

Urban flooding is when heavy rain overwhelms the stormwater drainage system. The Georgetown neighborhood is most affected by urban flooding from heavy rain, especially during high tides.

Both South Park and Georgetown experience both types of flooding. However, South Park experiences more severe coastal flooding, while Georgetown experiences mostly urban flooding.

As climate change causes sea levels to rise, the Duwamish River's highest tides will become higher. If nothing is done, Sea Level Rise (SLR) will make flooding worse.



By 2050, we expect to see about 1 foot of sea level rise. This image shows the average riverbank height in the industrial area of South Park with predicted flood elevations for 2050 if a king tide (the highest annual tide) and storm surge happen at the same time. Over 60 acres of land could be flooded several times each year.

This photo shows the predicted flood impacts for 2050. The December 2022 flood was an unexpected and extreme event that shows what will happen more often by 2050. The flood waters reached above the top step at tałtałucid Park: around 13 feet above the point from which we measure water height. As a precaution for the next king tide in February 2023, the City built temporary sandbag barriers up to around 15 feet. The sandbags show approximately the elevation of protection we will need to stop the Duwamish River from going over its banks by 2050.

NATIONAL HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH



Hispanic Heritage Month (HHM) takes place September 15 **to October 15** every year as a time to recognize and celebrate the many contributions, diverse cultures, and extensive histories of the American Latino community.

Beginning in 1968, Hispanic Heritage Month was originally observed as "Hispanic Heritage Week", but it was later extended to a month in 1988. Since then, HHM has been celebrated nationwide through festivals, art shows, conferences, community gatherings, and much more.

The month also celebrates the independence days of several Latin American countries, including: Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, and Nicaragua on September 15th, Mexico on September 16th, and Chile on September 18th. They also include holidays that recognize Hispanic contributions such as Virgin Islands-Puerto Rico Friendship Day that is celebrated in the U.S. Virgin Islands.

This year's theme is Building Prosperous and Healthy Communities. Building upon the theme will different weeks of action focusing on how the Administration has been supporting the Latino community:







Introduction

The Food Action Plan (Plan) is the City of Seattle's roadmap for an equitable, sustainable, and resilient local food system that supports healthy, vibrant communities.

The Plan outlines actions the City of Seattle can take to improve our local food system while advancing interrelated goals of racial and social justice, food security and food sovereignty, health, economic development, fair labor, environmental sustainability, climate action, and more. The Plan intends to reflect community priorities, and actions are implemented by an Interdepartmental Team (IDT) that includes advisors and staff from a dozen City of Seattle and King County departments that manage food programs.

The Food Action Plan 2024 Update (2024 Plan) is the first update since the original Plan was released in 2012. This 2024 Plan builds upon decades of work, action, and learning by government and Tribal policy advisors and program staff, community organizations and coalitions, food justice and food sovereignty leaders, and residents and participants of the many food programs across Seattle.

The updates in the 2024 Plan are rooted in the understanding that there are persistent economic, racial, and environmental inequities across our food system, from who experiences food insecurity to those exploited for labor in food industries to who can

What is meant by an equitable, sustainable, and resilient food system?

Equitable

Ensures equitable access to nutritious, affordable, and culturally relevant food, economic opportunities, and high-quality jobs and worker protections.

Sustainable

Produces food in ways that promote the health of ecosystems (soil, water, air, plants, animals) and communities now and in the future.

Resilient

Can withstand, adapt, and recover from major changes, disruptions, or shocks* in ways that ensure a sufficient supply of acceptable and accessible food for all.

*Climate change, natural disasters, pandemics, financial or political crises.

2024 UPDATE

What is New About the Food Action Plan

The 2024 Plan continues the City of Seattle's focus on increasing food security, supporting local food and the regional economy, and preventing food waste. New content, priorities, and approaches in the updated Plan include:

Focus on Racial & Social Equity

Explicit focus on addressing racial and social equity to align with the City of Seattle's [Race and Social Justice Initiative](#) (2004-present) and [Equity & Environment Initiative](#) (2015-present).

Food Justice Values

Guiding [Food Justice Values](#) developed by the Seattle Environmental Justice Committee.

Actions related to Pandemic & Climate Change Challenges

Actions that respond to a variety of interrelated food system challenges created by the COVID-19 pandemic and climate change, including worsening food insecurity and food system inequities, supply chain disruptions, and how the food system contributes to and is impacted by environmental and climate pollution.

New Framework to Organize the Plan's Content

Actions in the 2024 Plan are organized by [eight strategic priorities](#) based on the major themes from the [2021-2022 community engagement](#).



Strategic Priorities



1. Community Food Security

Build community food security through culturally relevant, equitable, nutritious food access.



2. Land Access & Use

Support Traditional Foods and regenerative practices, locally grown and harvested foods, and community food projects, focusing on communities historically excluded from land and water access and honoring Tribal sovereignty and treaty rights.



5. Local Supply Chains

Foster equitable, environmentally sustainable, and strengthened local supply chains.



6. Food Waste

Prevent food waste, rescue (redistribute) surplus food for people who need it, and compost the rest.



3. Education & Training

Expand access to culturally relevant and empowering food and nutrition education for youth, adults, and older adults.



4. Economy & Labor

Create an equitable, fair, and healthy local food economy for workers, businesses, and residents.



7. Environment & Climate

Reduce climate pollution associated with Seattle's food system and support regenerative food production practices that improve the environment and honor Tribal sovereignty and treaty rights.



8. Food Action Plan Stewardship

Create intentional structures and processes that enable effective coordination and implementation of the Food Action Plan in alignment with community and City values and priorities.


Food Access Disparities

Access to nutritious, affordable, convenient, and culturally relevant food is inequitable across Seattle, with some communities lacking physical access. Local mapping studies show that low-income and BIPOC neighborhoods have a higher percentage of unhealthy food retailers and longer travel times to healthy food retailers, especially in areas near the southern boundary around the Duwamish waterway (including Georgetown, South Park, Delridge, and High Point) and in small pockets in the north end [SEE FIGURE 5.²¹](#) Even when food is available, it may not be culturally relevant or acceptable due to dietary restrictions, religious practices, knowledge or capacity to prepare food, and personal taste preferences.

Transportation access is a critical factor in food access and food security.²² Lack of transportation for individuals and households may include those who do not own a car, have no access to reliable, affordable, and convenient public transportation, or cannot easily leave their home due to health or disability.

Food marketing also impacts food access and negatively affects children and teen health. Comprehensive studies show that food, beverage, and restaurant companies target children, teens, Black Americans, and Latinxs with marketing for their least healthy products.²³ Predatory marketing of unhealthy food and beverages, like tobacco and alcohol, contributes to the unfair distribution of poor health and the higher burden of disease.²⁴

Economy & Labor

Food sales, restaurants, food products, and food service are an important part of the local economy. In 2023, there were over 23,000 food-related jobs in Seattle alone.⁵⁷ In 2020-21, Seattle-area households spent 11.9% of their budget on food. Seattle-area households spent \$6,686 of their food dollars on food at home and \$3,568 on food away from home.⁵⁸ Seattle has a vibrant community of talented entrepreneurs, small-scale farmers, fishers, foodmakers, and chefs who have launched successful food businesses. Supporting new and emerging food businesses is critical for building a strong, local food economy.

Many of the conditions needed to increase spending in the local food economy already exist. There is high demand for local and culturally diverse foods through farmers markets, Community Supported Agriculture (CSA), restaurants, grocery stores, and food programs. Innovative food distribution models are under development and looking to aggregate local products to make it easier for smaller producers to access larger markets, such as school districts, grocery stores, universities, and bulk food sourcing programs in the hunger relief sector. Together, these types of advancements will make our local food economy stronger.

Focusing on a food system where Seattle's food is produced within the region supports jobs and keeps money in the local community. Local spending more than doubles the amount of money circulating among businesses in the community, and it strengthens a web of local relationships that can foster healthier communities and a more equitable, diverse, and resilient local food economy.⁵⁹

Environmental Racism

Environmental pollution and climate change are racial justice issues. Environmental racism is unequal access to a clean environment and basic environmental resources based on race. For many Tribes, environmental pollution and climate change are among the top risks to protection of cultural resources and treaty rights. In the U.S. and around the world, BIPOC communities are far more likely to live in areas with polluted air, water, and soil.^{60,61,62} Air pollution is considered the world's largest environmental health threat and the largest contributor to disease from the environment.⁶³ The main substances in air pollution affecting health are nitrogen oxides, sulfur oxides, ozone, and tiny particle pollution (dust, dirt, soot, smoke, liquid droplets) that can penetrate deep into the lungs and affect the body's circulatory system.⁶⁴ Air pollution causes and worsens asthma, cancer, several lung illnesses, and heart disease and is linked to low birth weight, heart attacks, and premature death.⁶⁵ BIPOC communities experience disproportionate and cumulative exposures to harmful environmental pollution, resulting in racial disparities in these health outcomes in Seattle and across the U.S.⁶⁶

In Seattle, BIPOC communities are disproportionately exposed to environmental hazards such as large industrial facilities, major roadways, poor air quality, and hazardous sites including the Lower Duwamish Waterway, a Superfund clean-up site that flows between the Georgetown and South Park neighborhoods.⁶⁷ Many of the same sources of air pollutants that harm health also emit carbon dioxide and methane, major greenhouse gases that trap heat and contribute to climate change.




Block Watch

Block Watch is a program based on the principle that neighbors working together are the first and best line of defense against crime.

Block Watch organizes and extends what you are probably already doing on an informal basis. We tend to know and watch out for our closest neighbors, but a group of neighbors at one end of the block who are doing this may not know the group of neighbors at the other end of the block. Organizing a Block Watch makes this attitude of watchfulness more systematic, and provides a block map or contact list with neighbors' names, telephone numbers and emails that can be used in case of an emergency.

The program usually requires two commitments:

- A commitment to be concerned about your neighbor's property and well-being as well as your own.
- A commitment to report suspicious activity and take action by alerting your neighbors and calling 9-1-1.

How Do I Get a Block Watch Started?

- 1. Contact your Crime Prevention Coordinator (CPC)** - for potential dates and times. Your CPC is related to your local police precinct.
- 2. Decide on location** - The meeting does not have to be at your home or even at a neighbors. It could also be a local library, community center, school or church.
- 3. Invite your neighbors to come** - The number of households and the size of the area to include are up to you. It helps to invite people in person.

What will happen at the first meeting?

At the initial meeting, we'll discuss:

- Area crime
- Crime trends
- Prevention measures
- Proactive things that neighbors can do to positively impact public safety

The CPC will bring printed resource materials, and a sign-up sheet to list contact information of participants. The sign-up sheet becomes the basis for your block watch map or telephone tree.

SAFETY TIPS



Keep exit stairwell doors closed for safety

Keep exit stairwell doors closed

When the weather warms up in the Seattle area, apartment stairwell exit doors sometimes get propped open to improve air circulation. It is very important to make sure these **doors remain closed** and are not held open with wedges or other devices. Not only is keeping stairwell exit doors open a violation of Seattle Fire Code, it can endanger evacuating residents in the event of a fire emergency.

During a fire, a closed door will help contain a fire and reduce the spread of smoke and toxic gases. Stairwells are used for primary evacuation and stairwell doors are designed to keep smoke out.



Si vive o trabaja en el Valle de Duwamish, usted sabe que el Valle de Duwamish se ve afectado a menudo por inundaciones.



Hay dos tipos de inundaciones: inundaciones ribereñas e inundaciones urbanas.

Las inundaciones ribereñas se producen cuando el río crece y se desborda. Esto ocurrió en diciembre de 2022. Son causadas por las mareas altas y las tormentas y la subida del nivel del mar debido al cambio climático hace que sean peor.

El vecindario de South Park y las zonas industriales se ven afectados principalmente por las inundaciones ribereñas provocadas por el desbordamiento del río Duwamish. También afecta a algunos residentes a lo largo de la ribera en South Park.

Las inundaciones urbanas se producen cuando las fuertes lluvias desbordan el sistema de drenaje de las aguas pluviales. El vecindario de Georgetown es el más afectado por las inundaciones urbanas provocadas por las fuertes lluvias, especialmente durante las mareas altas.

Tanto South Park como Georgetown sufren ambos tipos de inundaciones. Sin embargo, South Park sufre inundaciones ribereñas más severas, mientras que Georgetown sufre principalmente inundaciones urbanas.



Para 2050, se prevé una subida del nivel del mar de aproximadamente 1 pie. Esta imagen muestra la altura promedio de la ribera en la zona industrial de South Park con las elevaciones de inundación previstas para 2050 si se producen al mismo tiempo una marea rey (la marea anual más alta) y un aumento provocado por una tormenta. Más de 60 hectáreas de terreno podrían inundarse varias veces al año.

Esta foto muestra los impactos de las inundaciones previstas para 2050. La inundación de diciembre de 2022 fue un acontecimiento inesperado y extremo que muestra lo que ocurrirá con más frecuencia para 2050. Las aguas de la inundación llegaron por encima del escalón superior en Taft Lucid Park: unos 13 pies por encima del punto desde el cual medimos la altura del agua. Como precaución para la próxima marea rey de febrero de 2023, la ciudad de Seattle construyó barreras temporales de sacos de arena hasta unos 15 pies por la inundación prevista. Los sacos de arena muestran aproximadamente la elevación de protección que necesitaremos para evitar que el río Duwamish se desborde para 2050.






